LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION

Chinese (& explanations in French)

1. COURSE OBJECTIVES

The objective of this beginner Chinese course is to reach an A1 level as defined by the Council of Europe's Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). Students will learn the fundamental grammatical structures and syntax of modern Chinese. Additionally, there will be basic introductions to contemporary Chinese society related to the topics in the teaching materials.

At the end of this course, the student will be able to

- Understand familiar words and basic phrases about themselves, their family, and immediate surroundings when spoken slowly and clearly.
- Ask and answer simple questions in areas of immediate need or on very familiar topics.

3. COURSE CONTENTS

4. TEACHING METHOD

Regular attendance and active participation in class exercises are expected from students, along with the completion of required homework.

Instruction will cover the fundamental grammatical structures and syntax of modern Chinese. This course places a strong emphasis on developing listening and speaking skills. The classroom will feature extensive oral expression practice. Topics from the course materials will be supplemented with explanations about contemporary Chinese society and understanding Chinese culture. The class will also include training in written Chinese, with a small number of Chinese character writing practice and completion of some homework.

Unjustified absences from coursework contributing to the course mark will result in a zero for that portion of continuous assessment. Absences will only be excused in cases of illness, with a medical certificate provided to the Academic Administration Office. Students must inform the professor in advance of any absence.

5. COURSE MATERIAL

Primary instructional content will be a combination of teacher-developed materials and the textbook "你说呀 (Ni Shuo Ya)" by Arslangul Arnaud, Lamouroux Claude, Pillet Isabelle, Didier, 2016, along with additional resources as necessary.

6. EVALUATION

This course is assessed on a 'pass/fail' basis:

- Pass: no numerical mark is given, but the CEFR level achieved will be noted on the transcript.
- A numerical mark is given and noted on the transcript, and it will be considered for any compensation calculation.

The final grade is composed of:

- Continuous assessment throughout the course (50%)
- A final written exam(2h) at the end of the course (50%)

In case of a second-session resit, the written exam(2h) will account for 100% of the final grade.
