

Do you support a strictly delineated institutional right of evocation by the Council for mergers in sectors declared to have industrial policy importance?



## Should mergers with foreign companies be subject to additional substantive or procedural scrutiny?



#### IS FUTURE NOW MORE THAN 'DIML' DISCERNA BLE'?


### Do you support a longer time horizon of 5-7 years for counterfactual assessment under the EUMR?


### Should there be more emphasis on potential competition under the EUMR?
