Wojciech Wiewiórowski, Assistant Supervisor, EDPS. He has been Assistant European Data Protection Supervisor since December 2014. He was appointed by a joint decision of the European Parliament and the Council on 4 December 2014 for a term of five years.

Before his appointment, he was among others adviser in the field of e-government and information society for the Polish Minister of Interior and Administration and served as Inspector General for the Protection of Personal Data at the Polish Data Protection Authority, a position which he had held since 2010. He was also Vice Chairman of the Working Party Article 29 Group.

Prof. Lokke Moerel, Professor of Global ICT Law, Tilburg University, Senior of Counsel, Morrison & Dorester LLP. She is senior of counsel with Morrison & Foerster (Berlin), and professor of global ICT law at Tilburg University. Lokke is an expert on big data and Internet of Things. In February 2014, she accepted her professorship with the inaugural speech: "Big Data Protection. How to make the draft EU Regulation on Data Protection Future Proof". She was further appointed to author (together with Prof. Corien Prins) the 2016 report for the Netherlands Lawyers Association on the impact of the digital age on society and how to regulate information technology on society and how to regulate the relationship between IT and society: "Privacy for the Homo Digitalis: Proposal for a New Regulatory Framework for Data Protection in the Light of Big Data and the Internet of Things".



Mr Jeremy Rollinson, Director, Government Affairs, EU Institutions Corporate, External and Legal Affairs (CELA), Microsoft Europe. His work focuses on policy related to the EU Digital Single Market (DSM), with a particular emphasis on data issues and corresponding public policy covering privacy, cybersecurity, cloud policy, and the cross-border provision of online services. Prior to joining Microsoft, he worked at Nokia in the Government Relations team in the company's EU representative office, and was previously Director of the European Digital Media Association (EDiMA) in Brussels.



Mr Jens-Henrik Jeppesen, Director, European Affairs, at the Center for Democracy and Technology (CDT). In this role he is responsible for managing CDT's engagement with the EU institutions, Member States and other European-based international institutions. Prior to his current role, Jens led Dell's EMEA Government Affairs group, a function he established in 2007. He joined Dell from Intel, where he ran the company's EU Affairs office. Jens has also worked in consultancy, trade associations and at the European Commission.
