Andreas Mavroyiannis assumed his duties as Deputy Minister to the President of the Republic of Cyprus for European Affairs in October 2011 and they will end on January 2013. His portfolio has included the preparation of the Cyprus Presidency of the Council of the EU, representing the Government to EU Institutions as well as the Presidency and the Council before the European Parliament and managing the next Multiannual Financial Framework negotiations.

He joined the Diplomatic Service of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Cyprus in 1987. Previously, he has served as Permanent Representative of Cyprus to the European Union (2008-2011), as Permanent Representative of Cyprus to the United Nations (2003-2008), as Ambassador to France (1999-2002) and as Ambassador to Ireland (1997-1999).

During his tenure as Permanent Representative to the UN, he was one of the Vice-Presidents of the 62nd Session of the General Assembly of the United Nations (2007-2008). He has also been a Member of the Greek-Cypriot negotiating team in the Cyprus question bi-communal talks (2003-2008) and a Director of the Office of the Minister of Foreign Affairs (1995-1997, 2002-2003).

Andreas holds a PhD in Sociology (Université de Paris X – Nanterre), a Master's Degree in International Law, (Université de Droit et de Sciences – Paris ) a Master's Degree in Political Sciences (Université de Droit et de Sciences – Paris ) a Diploma in Law (University of Thessaloniki, Greece) and a Diploma of The Hague Academy of International Law.
